



Three brothers challenge the Convict Leasing System of forcing African American men into an Alabama prison in order to continue providing slave labor and county revenue post-Civil War.

Rigged – Steven Ellis

RIGGED is a slow burning thriller that peels back the curtain of a small, but pivotal, state senate race in the affluent suburbs of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. Modern-day digital marketing techniques, mastered in 2016 to stun the world, are now utilized to hold all levers of power. The intimate state senate race attracts a lot of financial attention with stakes so high.
